ST. MORITZ – ALPINE GLAMOUR ON 1822 METERS ABOVE SEA LEVEL

The spectacular mountain setting, pristine environment and countless sporting activities combined with world-class events, culinary extravagance and high design, create a lifestyle that can only be found in St. Moritz – urban glamour in the peaceful surroundings of the Swiss Alps.

In winter, St. Moritz transforms into a snowcovered winter wonderland with 350 km of pristine slopes, winter hikes and tobogganing, while event highlights such as the Snow Polo World Cup or the White Turf horse-racing set the tone on the frozen lake. In summer, the winter white turns into a blaze of colour, the sunny terraces of the mountains' huts and restaurants invite to stay, the exclusive shops offer the newest collections and the winding mountain passes attract motor sport enthusiasts. Amongst many other highlights – for example, the Festival da Jazz at the legendary Dracula Club – guests have the choice of countless sporting activities, such as golf, sailing, surfing or mountain biking.

SET IN AN ICONIC 1864 BUILDING, GRAND HOTEL DES BAINS KEMPINSKI OFFERS TIMELESS EUROPEAN LUXURY AT THE FOOT OF THE ST. MORITZ CABLE CAR WITH UNRIVALLED ACCESS TO THE SKI SLOPES AND HIKING TRAILS OF THE ENGADIN VALLEY.

What makes a place legendary is its celebrity and unique events. Above all, it is about extraordinary accomplishments. St. Moritz and the Engadin are both legends. It all started with the discovery of "healing" sources, the carbonated and iron-rich Mauritius Spring, which later led to spa tourism.

Today, Grand Hotel des Bains Kempinski is a contemporary and elegant hotel, perfect for sport lovers and leisure travellers alike. The hotel is set in an iconic building with a rich tradition since 1864 and offers 213 rooms and suites, including 27 spacious Alpine Suites with one to five bedrooms.

The location at the foot of the Signalbahn cable car and the legendary Hahnensee ski run offers guests to ski-in/ski-out to Corviglia and Corvatsch ski area, while the cross-country trails and walking paths in the hotel park lead directly to the lakes, forests and idyllic valleys of the Engadin.

Culinary delights can be tasted in the Kempinski Lobby & Bar and three awarded restaurants, including the 17 GaultMillau points accredited gourmet restaurant Cà d'Oro.

The Alpine Spa with the purifying and healthy Mauritius spring water offers the perfect blend of fitness, relaxation and beauty in 2,800 sq m. Further amenities include the Kempinski Kids' club with supervised indoor and outdoor activities, the in-house ski school and sport shop with just the right ski, tobogganing or cross-country skiing equipment, as well as room and concierge services. The four function rooms with natural light are ideal for creative meetings and events.

— THE HISTORY —

IF BUILDINGS COULD TALK, THIS HOTEL WOULD WHISPER TO YOU THE TALES OF A GRAND HISTORY. BUILT IN 1864 THE HOTEL HAS CREATED MEMORABLE MOMENTS FOR 155 YEARS, SINCE 2002 IT IS OPERATED BY KEMPINSKI.

It was not the mountaineering or skiing that attracted the first tourists, but the carbonated and iron-rich Mauritius Spring, which later led to spa tourism when the famed physician, Paracelsus, spread the mineral spring renown far beyond the Swiss borders.

In 1864, Grand Hotel des Bains was built directly next to this highest-altitude therapeutic springs in Switzerland. The original building consisted of two floors and was still without the striking corner towers. In 1887, the hotel received its first renovation, which gave the building a simple North Mediterranean palace look. In 1905, the two characteristic towers were added. At that time, guests only came during the summer months, attracted by the therapeutic spring, and made St. Moritz one of the most exclusive destinations in Europe.

A JOURNEY TO A ROYAL HERITAGE

From 1914 to 1958 the hotel was closed and only in the years 1928 and 1948 short-term open for the Olympic Winter Games.

The extensive 14 months renovations that give the Grand Hotel des Bains Kempinski its present aura began in October 2001. The work was carried out by the famed Viennese architect Franz Schnabel. The use of old engravings and photographs helped to restore the building's interior and exterior responsibly. Remarkably, beautiful murals can still be admired today in the library, in the Cà d'Oro and in the Ristorante Da Adriano, which creates a unique atmosphere simply because of its magnificent wall and ceiling elements.

The Alpine Spa is the place to be pampered after a day of outdoor adventure. Glacier water, Bergellerranite, mountain herbs and wood from the Engadin Valley all combine to create a rich alpine ambience. This luxurious oasis covers over 2,800 sq m and has an extensive sauna area with four different saunas, a steam bath, a laconium, a range of relaxation rooms and an atmospheric indoor pool and heated outdoor pool. There is also a gym, treatment rooms, Kneipp baths, an alpine garden and a separate ladies spa with relaxation rooms and three different saunas.

THE ALPINE SPA AN OASIS OF RELAXATION

The spa massages, body treatments and facials are tailored to the individual needs with care products made by Swiss Perfection, Voya, Bio Sculpture[®] and HydraFacial MD.

One highlight treatment is HydraFacial MD which treats fine lines and wrinkles, dry or dehydrated skin and pigment irritations with long-lasting effects without a scalpel and Botox. HydraFacial MD is a process that introduces active ingredients, such as antioxidants, vitamins and hyaluronic acid, directly into the deep layers of the skin. The use of LED therapy activates the body's own production of collagen and elastic skin cells. This treatment has no side effects and is suitable for all skin types and ages.

Guests can have a taste of history with a glass of the mineral-rich Mauritius Spring water directly from the source. It is precisely this unique water which has attracted visitors from all around the world to St. Moritz since the 15th century. This brings us back to the original idea of the spa: sanus per aquam (health through water).
